Congratulations on becoming a Certified Crop Adviser (CCA). You have demonstrated your knowledge in this profession and have signed the Code of Ethics as a practicing professional. The most important requirement in maintaining your certification is that of continuing education. Various organizations have applied to the Colorado CCA Board for CEUs in one or more of the four categories (Soil Fertility, Soil and Water Management, Crop Production, and Integrated Pest Management). The main purpose of this newsletter is to inform you of these opportunities so that you may plan accordingly.

There are three standing committees in the Colorado CCA Board. The Exam Committee is responsible for developing and testing the Colorado CCA exam. The Standards and Ethics Committee is responsible for reviewing all Colorado CCA applications and accepting those meeting the criteria of education and experience. In addition, this committee is responsible for reviewing any ethics violations of Colorado CCAs and recommending action to the State CCA Board. The Training Committee is responsible for reviewing applications by vendors seeking CEUs for training courses that they plan to give to Colorado CCAs and assigning CEUs in the proper category for appropriate courses. This committee also attempts to publicize the training courses available to Colorado CCAs.

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Members of these committees for 1995-1996 are:

Exam Committee -- Bill Gilbert, Wayne Gustafson, Frank Peairs, and Reagan Waskom, Chair. Standards and Ethics Committee -- Brad Austin, Mitch Yergert, and Dan Slinger, Chair. Training Committee -- Travis James, Roger Saffer, Kevin Miller, and Kathryn Apley, Chair.

The CCA program is National in scope, now involving 43 states. Over 5,000 have been certified, and this number may double during 1996. The National CCA Board has contracted with Meister Publications, Willoughby, Ohio to publish an 8-page insert in their magazine, <u>Ag Consultant</u>, five times per year. This tear-out insert will serve as a National CCA Newsletter. All CCAs will be included on the <u>Ag Consultant</u> mailing list, if they are not already receiving this magazine (No subscription cost). This Newsletter will provide information about national issues and list regional training opportunities which may be of interest.

Please encourage your colleagues to apply for this certification; it gives recognition of their professional competence as a crop adviser.

Differences in certification date among Colorado CCAs

As most of you know, about two-thirds of the 110 Colorado CCAs were certified prior to July 1, 1995, with the remaining group certified after that date. The difference in certification date affects your CEU period, as was explained by Kathryn Apley, Chair of the Training Committee, in her letter of November 14, 1995.

The Colorado CCA Board has been concerned about this situation and discussed it at length at our September Board meeting. The Board directed me to write to the National CCA Board, suggesting that the date of certification be the date of receipt of an individual's application forms at the National CCA office in Madison, Wisconsin. This request was discussed at the October meeting of the National CCA Board. They decided to deny our request and to continue to base the date of certification on the date that the Chair of the State Standards and Ethics Committee approves the application. Their reason for this decision was that the current rules are generally well understood and have performed adequately for the first 6,000 CCA registrants.

Therefore, it appears that each year there could be the same discrepancy in certification date of new CCAs, depending on when the application forms are submitted, processed, and approved. New applicants (those who have recently passed both the National and State Exams) must remember to submit their application forms prior to July 1 of that year, or they will have to retake their exams.
